World Heritage Missions

Event Descriptions

The Alamo

The Alamo was originally a Spanish mission church (1755-1793), it later played a vital role in the 1836 Battle of the Alamo. Some traces from the battle still exist but changes to the structure reflect its later role as a U.S. Army Quartermaster Depot warehouse and eventually a memorial to the Alamo Defenders. Visiting The Alamo in San Antonio is a powerful journey into Texas history. Located in the heart of downtown, this historic mission and fortress is the site of the famous 1836 battle where a small group of Texan defenders—including figures like Davy Crockett and James Bowie—fought for independence from Mexico.

River Tour

A Go Rio barge tour of the San Antonio River offers a unique and scenic way to experience the heart of downtown San Antonio. As you glide along the famous River Walk on a colorful, eco-friendly electric barge, a knowledgeable guide shares engaging stories about the city's rich history, architecture, culture, and local landmarks. The Go Rio tour brings new perspective to this vibrant and historic part of the city. You'll pass under historic stone bridges, float beside lush landscapes, and see iconic spots like the Arneson River Theatre, La Villita, and the towering restaurants and shops of the Rivercenter Mall.

Missions Tour

Visiting the San Antonio Missions National Historical Park offers a deep and immersive look into the early Spanish colonial history of Texas. This UNESCO World Heritage Site includes four beautifully preserved 18th-century missions—Mission Concepción, Mission San José, Mission San Juan, and Mission Espada—all connected by the scenic Mission Reach Trail along the San Antonio River. Expect to walk through centuries-old churches, stone walls, and historic farmlands as you learn about the daily lives of Indigenous peoples and Spanish missionaries who lived and worked in these communities. Each mission has its own unique character, with Mission San José known as the "Queen of the Missions" for its size and restored structures, including a working grain mill and original defensive walls. The park offers a peaceful and reflective experience, blending natural beauty with rich cultural history—a perfect combination of education, architecture, and the enduring spirit of early Texas.

El Mercado

A visit to El Mercado in San Antonio—also known as Historic Market Square—is a vibrant, immersive experience that captures the rich Mexican heritage of the city. As the largest Mexican market in the United States, El Mercado offers three city blocks of colorful sights, festive sounds, and tantalizing smells. Expect to find a bustling marketplace filled with handcrafted goods, folk art, embroidered clothing, leather goods, pottery, jewelry, and souvenirs from Mexico and Latin America. Vendors often set up both indoors and outdoors, with many speaking Spanish, adding to the authentic atmosphere. Local restaurants like Mi Tierra Café y Padería, open 24 hours, serve up classic Tex-Mex dishes, fresh pan dulce, and margaritas under festive papel picado and Christmas lights year-round.

Witte Museum

A visit to the Witte Museum in San Antonio is an engaging and family-friendly adventure through Texas history, science, and natural heritage. Located along the banks of the San Antonio River in Brackenridge Park, the Witte blends state-of-the-art exhibits with hands-on learning and stunning outdoor spaces. Inside, you'll find exhibits ranging from prehistoric dinosaurs and ancient rock art to South Texas ranching culture, Native American history, and early Texan pioneers. The Naylor Family Dinosaur Gallery features life-size skeletons and interactive displays, while the Texas Wild Gallery explores the state's diverse ecosystems and wildlife.
